Greetings and Happy Spring! This Manager's Message is about TREES. Trees can be a very controversial topic, some love them and others prefer not to have them around and the clean-up that goes with them. One of the 2024 Village Strategic Planning Goals concerns Forestry Management in the Village. The catalyst for this goal is the condition of the trees along M-81 in our downtown corridor. Many of the trees are struggling and at the end stage of life. They are all one species, the Bradford Pear. Planting one species of trees is not recommended by the Department of Natural Resources as disease can wipe out all your trees at once.

Our DPW crews will be removing the downtown trees and the Village will replant new trees in three different species with different colors of foliage more suitable to streetscape on M-81.

The Village has budgeted funds in the 2024 budget for this project and will be seeking grants to replace more trees in the Village. The grant funds may allow Cass City to enhance our downtown streetscape also.

In addition, the Village will be putting together a plan to address trees in our rightof-way (ROW) and their trimming, removal, and planting. More information will be forthcoming as the plan is finalized this year. Residents are reminded not to plant trees in the ROW without permission from the Municipal Building to make sure appropriate trees are planted.

If you should have any questions or concerns about the trees on Main Street or in your neighborhood, please contact the Municipal Office.

Ordinances Regarding Golf Carts and ATVs

With the warmer weather here and an increase in the operation of recreational type vehicles, we would like to remind everyone of some of the key requirements within the two ordinances. When operating a golf cart or ATV/ORV, the driver must have a valid operator's license; they cannot be driven on Main Street (M-81), but they may cross M-81.

Community Clean-up

This year's Village Cleanup Day will be **Saturday**, **June 8th 2024** from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm in the Municipal Parking Lot. You may bring couches, mattresses, carpet, scrap metal, refrigerators, freezers and air conditioners to put in a dumpster. All appliances containing freon must be tagged that freon has been removed. You may also bring up to eight (8) old tires for the tire collection at the same time. (No tires over 48" in height or 12" in width please).
