Water Tower



A new look for our water tower is planned. As part of a routine maintenance schedule, it is recommended that the exterior of the water tower be painted. The Village is seeking bids to repaint the tower with work to begin in July/August. Based on a local survey and Facebook comments, the newly painted water tower will sport a scripted "Cass City" at the top.

Street Construction



The Village of Cass City has a six year Street Improvement Plan in place. Major Road repairs will take place on Hill Street from Church to Dale Streets, and on Hunt Street from Huron to Brenda Street. Street work will also be done in other areas of the Village in 2019. The Capital Improvement Plan for the Village is allocating \$2.3 million for road repair over the next six years. The majority of the Village streets are in a "poor" rated condition, and such improvements are greatly needed.

May Clean Up Event



The Village of Cass City contracts with Emterra for trash and yard waste collection. It's time for our Annual May Clean Up event, mark your calendars! Thanks to Emterra, the spring clean up will be held on Saturday, May 18th from 9 am - 1 pm at the parking lot behind the Municipal Building. Emterra will provide the Village with three containers for collecting tires, appliances, and large items.

Sidewalk Program



One of the Strategic Planning Goals for 2019 is to prepare a Sidewalk Study on the location, condition, and needs for the Village. The Village currently has a program for sidewalk replacement which covers half or all of the costs, dependent upon circumstances. New Ordinance/Law



There will be some new ordinances (laws) on the books in 2019. Previously, if customers did not pay their water bill, the unpaid balance was rolled over onto the property taxes. The amendments to the Utilities ordinance will now allow for water shut off due to non-payment. This change was recommended due to the large number of unpaid accounts.

Basic Utility Billing Info



A bill, is a bill, is a bill - not exactly. The so-called "water" bills from the Village actually include water, sewer, and trash collection. The minimum charge for water is \$21.44 with a base of 1,667 gallons. The sewer base charge is \$31.83 for 3,333 gallons. Emterra trash collection is \$12.32 per month.

New Digital Sign



There's something new at the Municipal Building, it's the digital sign on the west end of the building. The old sign, software, and equipment was very temperamental and sometimes worked and other times not. Parts were hard to get as the equipment was very old. Repeated repairs and service visits this past year were required just to keep it up and running. Next time you are stopped at the Main Street traffic light, check it out!



No matter what the season, if there is a power outage lasting at least four (4) hours or more, the Hills and Dales General Hospital Corporate Services Building (formerly Baker College) will be open as a shelter. This location will offer heat or air conditioning, restrooms and a place for people to safely congregate and recharge phones if needed.
